When: Blocks are due at the November meeting or before. You can mail them to me at Karen Knowlton, 923 19th St, Port Townsend, WA 98368 if you can not attend the November meeting.

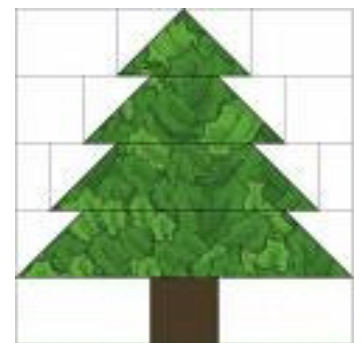
Where: Fifteen or thirty blocks will be returned to you at the December Christmas Party. If you will not be there, please ask someone to pick up your blocks for you, otherwise, I will call you and bring your blocks to the January, 2009 meeting for you. After that, I guess they are mine. Just kidding!

It's time to start those blocks for our Christmas Exchange!

How:

- ❖ Blocks are 6 1/2" unfinished of a Christmas motif.
- ❖ Blocks are for a standard horizontal setting; not for an on-point setting.
- ❖ Make 15 blocks for the exchange and turn them in with your name on the back of the block printed in the margin.
- ❖ Please put your blocks in a sandwich bag with your name in black marker on the outside of the bag.
- ❖ You may make 16 blocks if you wish to keep (1) for yourself.
- ❖ You may make 2 sets of blocks if you wish to get 30 back in the exchange.
- ❖ Blocks will be distributed based on degree of difficulty. If you wish to get a series of 15 blocks back that were more difficult to make; then you must turn in blocks that are above average in difficulty such as a mariner's star or a hand appliquéd block with many pieces. If you turn in a square in a square, that will be considered an average block. Blocks made on an embroidery machine will be counted as average.
- ❖ No 4 patch blocks will be accepted.
- ❖ Blocks that are smaller than 6 1/2" will not be accepted.

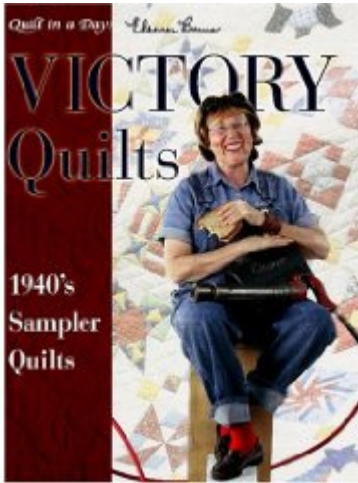

Many thanks to those who are stepping up and stepping in! The enthusiasm is contagious!

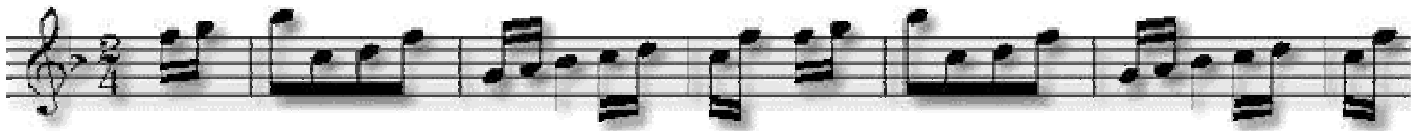

48" x 48"--any shape or size, as long as it fits within this limitation.

Quilts will be presented for voting at our January 2009 guild meeting. Each quilt will be accompanied by a card posted with your title. Your name will not be revealed until the quilt show in February.

I will also accept registrations at the November and December meetings. If you give them to me at the Meeting, be sure to include 2 copies and a stamped, self-addressed envelope.

Complete a form for each quilt or item and send the original and one copy to Karen Knowlton, 923 19th St, Port Townsend, WA 98368. I will return to you one of the copies of your form with an entry number on it. This is for your records. I will also be sending you a separate Quilt ID form to be attached to your quilt when you deliver them to the drop-off point.

You may enter 5 items plus a challenge quilt. Please indicate a hanging priority for your 5 items. Categories are listed below. Please remember a quilt quilted by anyone else makes it a GROUP QUILT. If you have questions about the category for your item, please call Karen 360-344-3959 or send a photo of your quilt or item with your registration and we will put it in the appropriate category.

- Traditional: Predominately pieced and based on well established or customary in design, fabric and color choice.
- Innovative: Quilts which show a fundamental deviation from traditional patterns and sets.
- Art: Quilts which are of original design and are a step beyond traditional designs.
- Appliqué: Predominately hand or machine appliquéd.
- Holiday & Special Occasion: A quilt which has been made to celebrate a holiday or a special occasion such as a new baby, wedding, anniversary, etc. You do not have to enter your quilt in this category but may put it in traditional, innovative, art, appliqué, etc.
- Miniature/Small: A quilt that is a small version of a large quilt and is 72" or less in circumference.
- Challenge: Must meet all challenge criteria. These entries will be voted on at the January guild meeting. Challenge quilts not meeting requirements will not be voted on or shown at the January meeting, nor displayed in the quilt show.
- Wearable's: Any quilted item intended to be worn.
- Other: Must have three layers, items such as tree skirts, table runners.
- Group: Any quilt worked on by two or more persons including commercial quilting.

Comments: Comments about how you came to make your quilt or item make the show much more interesting. Please give credit if a pattern, book or class inspired your creation. The length of your comments must be limited to 25 words as there is simply not room on the label or the program for more. If you have a special story that goes with the quilt but exceeds these guidelines, you can do one of two things. Submit the information on a display ready sheet with your quilt registration or with the quilt at the drop-off point. Make sure you submit the information sheet so that it will not get crumpled, ripped or dirty.

Special handling instructions: Please indicate the top of your quilt by pinning a label saying "top" at the top. This is not necessary if there is an obvious top. Give us any other hanging requirements.
