## January 2026 Kitsap Quilters Guild Minutes—Mary Jo Brisbon

President, Katherine Holtgraves, called the meeting to order at 6:00 PM. The guild welcomed three visitors.

### Business of the Guild

There was a correction to the November meeting minutes as published in the newsletter. The amount of the gift card for completing the puzzle in the Sherry's Cozy Quilt ad was incorrectly stated as \$50 rather than \$15. The corrected minutes were unanimously approved on a motion by Betty Wing and second by Maureen Hirsch.

Jan Kohler gave the Treasurer's Report for both November and December. Checking balance at the end of December was \$40,359.24. Savings balance was \$5,944.17.

There will be no zoom board meeting in February as the board will be meeting in person for a mid-year check-in.

**Quilt Show, Darlene Boggs:** There is a need for more volunteers in many areas of the show, especially during take down, as we will not be having the youth cadets this year. If you did not receive your drop-off labels for your registered quilts, please contact Debi Snyder. If you are volunteering on Wednesday, please bring your own lunch. Thursday's volunteer lunch will be provided by the guild. Saturday the show will end at 4:00 PM. Please submit your expense vouchers to Darlene, who needs to approve them before Jan can process them.

**Shopping Boutique, Mary Jane Efstathiou and Becky Holt:** Items will be accepted at check-in on Wednesday from 3:00 to 6:00. If you are volunteering for set up on Wednesday, you can turn in your items after 10:00. You must pick up any unsold items at 4:00 on Saturday. If you are bringing your items in a plastic container, please put your name on both the container and the lid. There is no inventory sheet this year unless you want to keep one for yourself. Each item must have two tags; one tag will be kept by the boutique team to track items sold. Make sure the tags are securely attached to the items (bagging and stapling are suggested). If you are selling a kit, note on the tag if it is complete or

**Raffle Quilt 2027 Committee:** The committee members were asked to stand and were thanked for stepping up to take on the task of designing and creating our next raffle quilt. The committee will provide more details after the quilt show at the March general meeting.

**Spring Retreat:** Sign-ups took place prior to the meeting and we have enough attending to satisfy our commitment to Seabeck. Jeannette Schanbeck and her team have a jam-packed retreat planned – no sleeping at spring retreat!

**President's Message, Katherine Holtgraves:** The January/February secret friends activity promises fun and sweet wishes for others. Supplies and directions for making six valentine themed items of various skill/time levels were put in boxes. Those wanting to participate were asked to put their name on a scratch off ticket, select a box for the item they want to make and a return bag, and draw a ticket identifying their secret friend. The reveal will take place at the February 24<sup>th</sup> meeting. The final secret friend activity will take place in May, where members participating will select the person receiving their gift.

**Program Speaker, Lynn Czaban:** Lynn is an award-winning quilting artist, who presented a jaw dropping trunk show of portrait quilts. She has been quilting since the 1980's and began creating portrait quilts in 2005. Her work is featured in the book *Emergence: Fiber Art from Concept to Stitch*, a juried exhibit by 21 selected members of the Oregon region of Studio Art Quilt Association (SAQA), published in 2022. The detail and authenticity of her work was impressive and truly amazing.!


**Hospitality Drawing, Pam Whitt:** Ten lucky members received fabulous prizes related to the theme of organization and keeping track of time.

## 3rd Saturday Workshops—Audrey Fitzgerald

Debi Snyder will be guiding the **21 March** workshop through making a traditional string quilt. You may want to start saving your scraps (or “strings”) of differing lengths with widths varying from 3/4” to 2 ½”. You will need about 1 ½ to 2 yards of strings to make a lap quilt and about 1 ¾ yards of neutral or complementary yardage for the background. If you are interested in making a wall quilt, you will need ¾ yards for the background. The beauty of this quilt is it is a great way to burn through your scrap strips indiscriminately or create a quilt that you have gently nudged into a particular colorway or design.

On **18 April**, Jeannette Schanbeck will be showing us how to make a bag so big you can park a VW Bug in it (just kidding) while collapsing down so small it can store in something smaller than a shoe box (this part is true). It is truly a cavernous bag that can carry just about anything. The possibilities are really endless regarding what you would use it for. Warning though, it does everything but stand up on its own.

In May, we will be back to quilt making. Katherine Holtgraves is hosting the **16 May** offering and will be teaching puff quilt techniques. This style is visually appealing and encourages quilt snuggling if you are into that sort of thing. Puff quilts are great for pets and young ones, and the size of the block is very easy to adjust.

In person signups for workshops are in the church lobby during guild meetings. If you are not able to sign up for a workshop in person, please contact me to sign up ([audrey@audreyfitzgerald.com](mailto:audrey@audreyfitzgerald.com)). Unless otherwise stated, the workshops run from 10:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. at the church and there is a \$5.00 class fee. Supply lists will be emailed out a couple of weeks before the workshop to allow for the gathering of materials.

Second Place: **Barbara Martin** for *I Love Geometry*


First Place: **Diane Levang** for *Eye Test*

## BARBARA MARTIN

I am so honored to be the Featured Artist at this year's quilt show. It is always so much fun (and work) to help with the quilt show each year, and this year will be extra special.

My family had lots of sewers. As early as fourth grade I would go to my maternal Grandma's house to sew. More than one doll quilt came out of those sessions.

My paternal Grandma was an accomplished quilter, but we lived several states away, so we spent time together infrequently. She provided beautiful quilts for special occasions.

Years after her death my aunt sent me her patterns from the Kansas City Star, a few early quilt brochures, and the last hand pieced blocks she worked on.

My mom took up quilting not long after I did, and we enjoyed years of sewing together. I started quilting in 1993 in Fairbanks, Alaska. It stayed with me as we moved back to Washington in 1995. The working and quilting years are a blur. Lots of patterns, UFO's and some great quilts.

Retiring in 2016 opened the door for some new things. I joined two guilds and my quilting world expanded. Before the pandemic I began to design my quilts, using traditional methods. I wandered into curved shapes through wedges, moving onto curves and freezer paper pattern making. I focused on those techniques during the pandemic.

Moving to Improv techniques with the Improv Group and combining my love of curves is the current focus of my quilting. The learning never ends!

Congratulations, Barb, on achieving this very deserved honor. Your booth will be a quilt show highlight.

### ***Curtains for Kitty Cats***

*If you have some spare solid fabric in your stash and would like to help out homeless kitties please read on. The Kitsap Humane Society is in need of curtains to place on the front of kennels that are used to house cats and/or kittens. These kennels are where new arrivals to KHS are housed and not yet available for adoption. The curtains provide privacy for the kitties especially since many of them are scared and/or shy. Ideally 60 curtains are needed, but we will gladly accept whatever you have time for. Thank You, Eva (KHS volunteer).*

*Kitty Curtains:*

*Solid color fabric 20" X 40"*

*1/4" elastic length 25" (per curtain)*

*2 buttons (about 1 inch diameter)*

*Hem the edges*

*Make a sleeve at the top edge for the elastic placing it about 2 inches from the top edge*

*Place a button at each side, approx. an inch from in from each side edge and in line with the elastic sleeve*

*Extend the elastic out 5 inches on each side. Fold it over so there is a 2.5 inch loop. Securely sew the ends of the loop together*

*and attach to curtain edge*

*(This loops around a bar on the kennel, from back to front, and goes over the button to hold the curtain in place)*

Join the fun! This month we will be handing out instructions and a single 2.5 inch square for the 2026 In-House Quilt. You add solid white and bright fabrics. This year's block will finish at 11.5 inches, and you can make 1 or 2 blocks. Everyone who participates gets the opportunity to win the finished quilt. You will receive one entry ticket for each block you complete.

Completed blocks will be collected at the April meeting.

**IN HOUSE QUILT BLOCK**

**CUT FABRICS:**

White

- 2 - 2.5" x 9.5"
- 1 - 1.5" x 7.5"
- 1 - 1.5" x 6.5"

Bright Solid #1

- 1 - 6.5" Square

Bright Solid #2

- 1 - 2.5" x 9.5"
- 1 - 2.5" x 7.5"

Use Attached Blue 2.5" Square



**ASSEMBLE BLOCKS**

Measurements include 1/4" seam allowances. Sew with right sides together unless otherwise stated.

Press seams in directions indicated by arrows on diagrams. If no direction is specified, press seam toward darker fabric.

1. Gather a 6 1/2" square from one bright solid. From a different bright solid, gather a 2 1/2 x 9 1/2" rectangle and a 2 1/2 x 7 1/2" rectangle.
2. Sew a solid white 1 1/2 x 6 1/2" rectangle to left-hand edge of bright solid 6 1/2" square (Diagram 1). Add a solid white 1 1/2 x 7 1/2" rectangle to bottom edge.



3. Sew bright solid 2 1/2 x 7 1/2" rectangle to bottom edge of Step 2 unit (Diagram 2). Add bright solid 2 1/2 x 9 1/2" rectangle to left-hand edge.



4. Sew together a solid white 2 1/2 x 9 1/2" rectangle and a solid blue 2 1/2" square to make a pieced rectangle (Diagram 3).

5. Sew a solid white 2 1/2 x 9 1/2" rectangle to bottom edge of Step 3 unit (Diagram 4). Join pieced rectangle to left-hand edge to make a block. The block should be 11 1/2" square including seam allowances.




