February 27, 2024 General Membership Meeting

President Jeannette Schanbeck called the meeting to order at 6:02 pm

BUSINESS MEETING

Minutes: The January 23, 2024 General Membership minutes were approved as published in the December newsletter. A motion was made by Brynn Graham and passed by a unanimous voice vote.

Treasures Report: Checking Balance \$29364.92 Savings Balance \$9,935.49

Luisana Sawyer gave a preliminary report on the Quilt Show numbers. Door entry - \$9259.00, Café - \$535.26 (85.00 profit). Boutique Gross Income – 12984.50, the guilds 15% is 1707.53, Bucket Raffle - \$1135.00, Donations - \$799. Our projected profit will be about \$6500.

Marbled Arts will be retiring and not available for next year. Demonstrations were well attended. The Washington Youth Academy Cadets were a delight to work with and very much appreciated. They were quick and very willing to find someone to help. They were treated to vouchers to the Food Trucks for their dinner. Island Lumpia did not accept pay for the cadets that chose to dine there. Aprons were a hit and the little quilts pinned to them made by MarvaLee an added bonus. Ann Rickle washed all of the aprons and they are ready for next year. Our featured artists; Debi Snyder and Nancy Parrott put on fantastic displays in their booths and were well received. Tentative reservation for next year has been made for February 14 & 15. They have asked for 10 quilts to start with measuring approx 48" X 55" or Lap Size. The guild is going to also supply bags for the quilts to be carried in to make it easier for the patients to bring them to their appointments. I will collect and deliver the quilts to them. Membership—Chris Miller

We currently have 172 members as of today (3/4/24). The quilt show brought us 15 new members and 4 rejoining members. We have membership cards for all members. If you have not picked up your card, they are available at the membership table before our meetings. Most of the nametag orders have been placed and received. I will be doing another order around the 20th of March if anyone wishes to order.

3rd Saturday Workshop—Audrey Fitzgerald

The 16 March class will be a triangular shaped zippered storage bag similar to the iron cover bag offered in one of the last Monthly Mystery projects. Sample bags are at the Education table in the lobby. Bags are very fast and easy to make, so it will be possible to make more than one bag in the class. Up to two free zippers will be offered to each participant for the bags they make in the workshop. If you would prefer to make an iron cover, some complete kits are still available for \$10. If you like the idea of making the iron cover but want to use your own fabric for the outer layer, you can purchase the kit for \$7. This workshop will be led by Audrey Fitzgerald.

The 20 April workshop is an organizer for your work space that doubles as a sewing machine cover. When your sewing machine is sitting in it, it not only muffles noise and eases vibrations, it also offers a double row of pockets that fall below your work surface for notions you want to keep on hand. A removable thread catcher is also included. The organizer can also double as a sewing machine cover with two ties to secure the draped sides together. A sample product is not yet available for viewing, but members can review the pattern at the sign up table to confirm interest. Debbie McKeever will be leading this workshop.

On 18 May you will have an opportunity to make a large carry all tote with wooden handles. This was identified as the favorite project in the past Monthly Mystery survey. Sample bags are on the Education table in the lobby. This tote really is a workhorse, is quick to make, can be adapted to just about any size (I have actually seen a quilter use a larger tote to carry her sewing machine to a sewing event) and it is easy to embellish with quilting, outside pockets or a stiff interfacing to make it a sturdy, stand up bag. Jeannette Schanbeck will be heading up this workshop.

Sign ups for workshops are in the church lobby during guild meetings. If you prefer, email me, Audrey Fitzgerald, at to sign up. The workshops run from 10:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. at the church and there is a \$5.00 class fee. Supply lists will be emailed to out a couple of weeks before the workshop to allow for the gathering of materials.

Please remember that workshops are led by quilters like you who have volunteered to share a project with their fellow guild members. If there is something that you enjoy doing or a favorite project that might be of interest to our group and you would like to share, please contact me. Fresh ideas are always welcome, and the workshop crowd is really a pretty fun bunch. Attending the workshops is also a great way to meet other guild members since the group size generally does not exceed 20 people.

In-House Quilt—Nancy Mathisrud and Marj Deupree

We are going to have a scrappy quilt for the first 2024 In-House Quilt. You will make 4 identical 4.5" (unfinished) blocks and sew them together to make one 8.5" (unfinished) block. Each block will finish at 8" and members may contribute up to four 8.5" blocks. Each block earns one entry into the drawing for the finished quilt.

Fabric Selection: This is a two color quilt. One color should be red, pink, blue, yellow, or orange. The other should be white, off-white, or white-on-white.

Cutting: You will need to cut four (4) 4.5" squares from your "colored" fabric and eight (8) 2.5" squares from your "white" fabric.

Piecing: Draw a diagonal line from corner to corner on the back side of each 2.5" square. Place the corner of a white square on the corner of a colored square, right sides together and sew on the drawn line. Repeat for the other 3 colored squares.

Trim off the excess fabric from the corners. Press the seams. Tip: If you press the seams on two of the blocks towards the center and press the other two towards the outside, you can nest them when you sew the four blocks together.

Sew the four blocks together as shown in the picture to make an "X".

Blocks may be turned in to Nancy Mathisrud or Marj Deupree at the March or April meetings. Be sure they are labeled with your name. No blocks will be accepted after April 30th. The drawing is tentatively scheduled for the June meeting.

Questions? Ask Nancy () or Marj ().

For any new quilters who wish to try this out and want more information, there are tutorials on YouTube for XO quilt blocks. Note that they may be using different sizes than what we have above.

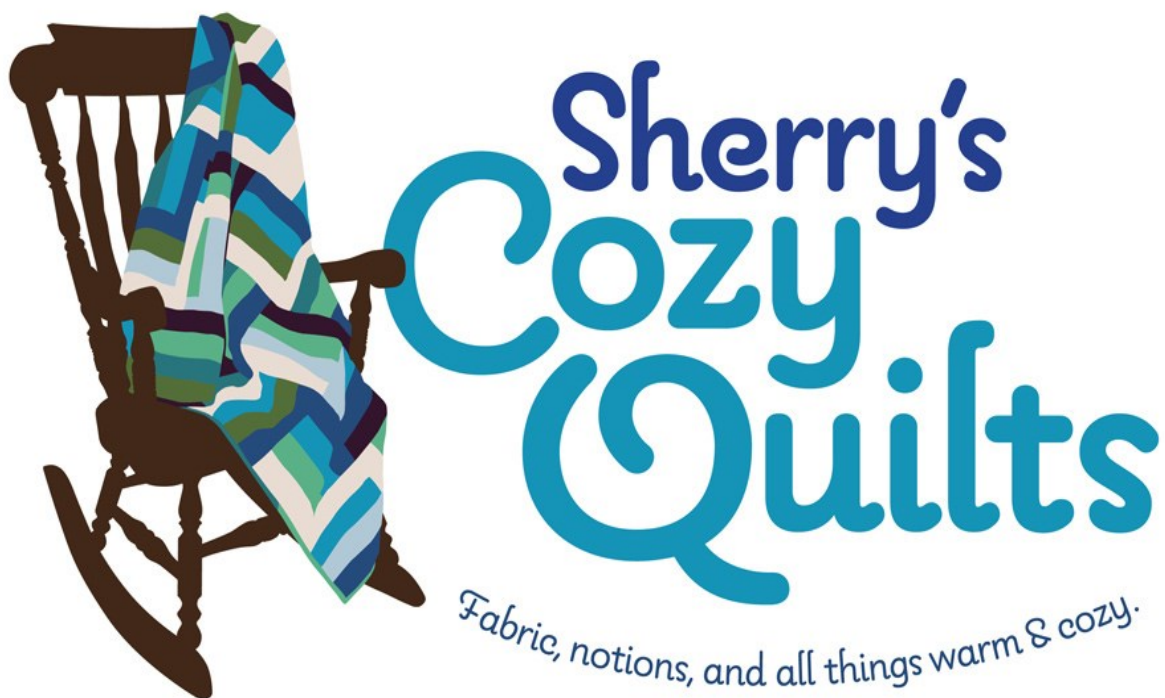
