3rd Saturday Workshop—Audrey Fitzgerald

The 20 April workshop is an organizer for your work space that doubles as a sewing machine cover. When your sewing machine is sitting in it, It not only muffles noise and eases vibrations, it also offers a double row of pockets that fall below your work surface for notions you want to keep on hand. A removable thread catcher is also included. The organizer can also double as a sewing machine cover with two ties to secure the draped sides together. A sample product is not yet available for viewing, but members can review the pattern at the signup table to confirm interest. Debbie McKeever will be leading this workshop.

On 18 May you will have an opportunity to make a large carry all tote with wooden handles. This was identified as the favorite project in the past Monthly Mystery survey. Sample bags are on the Education table in the lobby. This tote really is a workhorse, is quick to make, can be adapted to just about any size (I have actually seen a quilter use a larger tote to carry her sewing machine to a sewing event) and it is easy to embellish with quilting, outside pockets or a stiff interfacing to make it a sturdy, stand up bag. Jeannette Schanbeck will be heading up this workshop.

Sign ups for workshops are in the church lobby during guild meetings. If you prefer, email me, Audrey Fitzgerald, at to sign up. The workshops run from 10:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. at the church and there is a \$5.00 class fee. Supply lists will be emailed to out a couple of weeks before the workshop to allow for the gathering of materials.

Please remember that workshops are led by quilters like you who have volunteered to share a project with their fellow guild members. If there is something that you enjoy doing or a favorite project that might be of interest to our group and you would like to share, please contact me. Fresh ideas are always welcome, and the workshop crowd is really a pretty fun bunch. Attending the workshops is also a great way to meet other guild members since the group size generally does not exceed 20 people.

Kitsap Quilter's First Ever Library Quilt Challenge

At the March meeting, the first ever Kitsap Quilter's Library Challenge was announced. This challenge is designed to get our members using and exploring the books in our wonderful library. It's not too late to join! If all the Kaffe books get checked out, check the Kitsap Library system for other copies.

Challenge – Use a Kaffe Fassett book from the library (or your own) to make one of Kaffe's Quilts. You do not need to use his fabric.....

Size – the quilts can be any size – maybe a downsized or improv version of one of Kaffe's pattern – use your imagination or stick to his pattern.

Timeline – we will show the quilts/quilt tops at the September meeting, giving us plenty of time to get a top or entire quilt completed. At the meeting we'll each share what book and pattern we used, and reveal our quilts.

We are going to have a scrappy quilt for the first 2024 In-House Quilt. You will make 4 identical 4.5" (unfinshed) blocks and sew them together to make one 8.5" (unfinished) block. Each block will finish at 8" and members may contribution up to four 8.5" blocks. Each block earns one entry into the drawing for the finished quilt.

Fabric Selection: This is a two color quilt. One color should be red, pink, blue, yellow, or orange. The other should be white, off-white, or white-on-white.

Cutting: You will need to cut four (4) 4.5" squares from your "colored" fabric and eight (8) 2.5" squares from your "white" fabric.

Piecing: Draw a diagonal line from corner to corner on the back side of each 2.5" square. Place the corner of a white square on the corner of a colored square, right sides together and sew on the drawn line. Repeat for the other 3 colored squares.



Trim off the excess fabric from the corners. Press the seams. Tip: If you press the seams on two of the blocks towards the center and press the other two towards the outside, you can nest them when you sew the four blocks together.



Sew the four blocks together as shown in the picture to make an "X".



Blocks may be turned in to Nancy Mathisrud or Marj Deupree at the March or April meetings. Be sure they are labeled with your name. No blocks will be accepted after April 30th. The drawing is tentatively scheduled for the June meeting.

For any new quilters who wish to try this out and want more information, there are tutorials on YouTube for XO quilt blocks. Note that they may be using difference sizes than what we have above.

Celebrating our Favorite Quilts Part 1 of 2

Our quilt shows fulfil many needs. One of the most popular is to share our work with guild members and the community at large. Another is to get feedback on our efforts and encouragement to continue exploring patterns and techniques. Over 800 votes were cast by visitors to the February show and the top ten quilts and their makers were awarded ribbons at the February meeting. Pictures are worth a thousand words, but often it is the story behind our quilts that make them special. Below are the top five makers who have graciously shared their quilts and their stories. The next five will be featured in the May newsletter. Congratulations to all!

Pam Whitt 1st Place: Daisies A Buzz

When I started quilting in 1984 and then joined Kitsap Quilters when it was formed, I did all of my quilting by hand. In 1991 I put quilting on hold for quite a few years to raise my family and when I rejoined KQ, almost everyone machine quilted their quilts or sent them to a longarm. I started quilting on my Pfaff and enjoyed it for years but realized I loved quilting more than piecing, so I purchased a longarm in 2021 and dedicated as much time as possible to practicing. After quilting several traditional quilts, I found that I liked the creativity of free motion quilting and while browsing on spoonflower.com I ran across this fabric and fell in love with it. The background areas were perfect for free motion quilting, and I let the bees and daisies inspire me as to how to quilt them, which was definitely out of my comfort zone, but I learned a lot and truly enjoyed the process of creating this quilt.



Pam Whitt 2nd Place: The Belles of the Ball

The beautiful ladies in this quilt are a collection of pieces embroidered by myself, my grandma and those purchased in antique stores. I assembled it in large sections made up of several ladies and filler pieces to make the overall block fit the section next to it, kind of like making my own puzzle. I quilted it on my longarm and thoroughly enjoyed spending time with each Belle as I decided how to quilt her while admiring her beautiful dress and embroidery. The scalloped border was intended to look similar to how their dress swung out as they "danced" around the quilt together. I really enjoyed making this and getting these beautiful Belles out of boxes and dresser drawers to be admired once again.

Debi Snyder 3rd Place: *Times and Seasons*

2000 Piecemaker's calendar quilt. This quilt has been in and out of the UFO bin for 18 years, I started this quilt thinking it would take a year as the 1999 Piecemaker's calendar quilt had, but other projects kept drawing my attention. This quilt is hand appliqued, embroidered, and quilted. The background fabrics were bought specifically for this quilt, but all the other pieces came out of my scrap bins. I hand dyed most of the silk ribbon I used in the silk embroidery being limited to what I had on hand during the pandemic. There is another Piecemaker's calendar quilt hiding in my UFO bin at this time waiting for the embroidery to be done, except for the embroidery it will be all machine done.



Andrea Rudman 4th Place: David



I've been doing "piecework" since 1969. I did my first quilt in 1972 and still have it. I'm self-taught and became an avid follower of Eleanor Burns. Whereas I prefer patchwork, I've been known to do some applique. I helped bring English paper piecing back before the pandemic.

I'd done some foundation piecing in the past, but David is a whole other level. The pattern is by LegitKits. I found them because I wanted to do *Skulliver*. In June 2022, I became a tester on David. He is a 2-sided quilt, and my machines would not do free motion on him. I broke 2 machines pushing him through a 5.5" throat and then my back went. I was able to finish him for the 2024 show. David took 227 hours to make.

Nancy Mathisrud 5th Place: Star Quilt

I fell in love with Tula Pink's "Inspiration" quilt. It was designed by Tula Pink with her fabric. The star has 2200 paper pieces in it. Bob, my husband and KQ member designed the pattern for each diamond in the star and quilted it.




