
Membership—Chris Miller

Christmas Block Exchange



For our new guild members, it's been a tradition to exchange holiday blocks at our Christmas Potluck dinner in December.

You can start shopping for fabric and picking a pattern for a fun 12.5" unfinished block pattern. You will need to make 6 blocks of the same block and 7 if you want one for yourself.

Registration to participate in the block exchange will be available at the September, October and November meetings, then you will receive an assortment of fun blocks in December.

The rules to participate

are as follows:

- No blocks on point
- No 4 or 9 patch blocks

- No panels with a border added.
- No synthetic fabric
- Blocks must measure 12.5 inches including the seam allowance.
- Flannel, felt or wool may only be used for embellishment, which you are free to use, but please attach by sewing.
- All appliqued pieces must be sewn down.
- Put your name on the back seam allowance of each block.
- You may make two sets of different blocks, but no more than 12 blocks will be accepted from one person.

Any blocks not following the rules will be returned to the maker.

Place each set of blocks in a separate zip lock bag labeled with your name. Blocks will be accepted until the November meeting. Your bag will be returned to you at the Christmas party with 6 fun blocks done by your guild buddies. If you cannot make the party, we will bring your blocks to the January meeting.

In-House Quilt—Nancy Mathisrud, Marj Deupree and Mary Jane Efstathiou

This fall's In-House quilt will be another where you use your own fabrics. You must make pairs of 8.5" (unfinished) blocks. One block will be an "X" block and one block will be an "O" block. You may make up to 4 pairs. With elections coming up, this will be a patriotic quilt using red, white and blue fabric. For each block, you will make 4 identical 4.5" (unfinished) blocks and sew them together to make one 8.5" (unfinished) block. Each block will finish at 8" and members may contribution up to 4 pairs of 8.5" blocks. Each block earns one entry into the drawing for the finished quilt.

Fabric Selection: One color must be red, blue or a red/white/blue combination.. The other should be white, off-white, or white-on-white.

Cutting: You will need to cut four (4) 4.5" squares from your "colored" fabric and eight (8) 2.5" squares from your "white" fabric.


Piecing: Draw a diagonal line from corner to corner on the back side of each 2.5" square. Place the corner of a white square on the corner of a colored square, right sides together and sew on the drawn line. Repeat for the other 3 colored squares.

Trim off the excess fabric from the corners. Press the seams. Tip: If you press the seams on two of the blocks towards the center and press the other two towards the outside, you can nest them when you sew the four blocks together.

Block 1: Sew the four blocks together as shown in the picture to make an "X".



Block 2: Sew the four blocks together as shown in the picture to make an "O".

Blocks may be turned in to Nancy Mathisrud, Marj Deupree or Mary Jane Efstathiou at the November meeting. Be sure they are labeled with your name. No blocks will be accepted after November 30th. The drawing is tentatively scheduled for the January meeting. Questions? Ask Nancy () or Marj ()

For any new quilters who wish to try this out and want more information, there are tutorials on YouTube for XO quilt blocks. Note that they may be using difference sizes than what we have above

Show Us the Money!

The Member's Spotlight for October needs to be on high beam to cover all the accomplishments of our new treasurer, **Barb Martin**. Barb joined the guild in 2016 after she retired. In her own words, she has "...volunteered for many positions in support of KQ operations and activities. I have been Vice President, President, Program Chair, Treasurer Elect and now Treasurer. I enjoy helping with other activities as time allows."

I would like to expand on a few of those 'other activities. My first memory of Barb was as a presenter in a Third Saturday Workshop on how to use large wedge rulers. Noting her superpower for teaching, I later recruited her to present two more workshops, one on inset circles and another on transparency using circles. She later assisted Terry Loy with the standout workshop, Rediscovered Dresdens.

Barb is currently the scribe for the guild's Improv Group. She keeps us all straight on who is doing what when, as well as educating us on improv techniques. She also was in charge of demonstrations for last year's quilt show. Do we see a theme here?

Barb's talents, as you might expect, transcend teaching, and come to full expression as a creative quilter. One need only look at last year's raffle quilt, which she designed and stitched, to affirm her expertise.

As I recall, Barb was also instrumental in getting the guild set up with Zoom activities during Covid. That capability which allowed us to stay in touch during that unprecedented time was the glue that held the guild together.

With this bit of history behind us, here is an updated reprisal of a previous interview written by Barb when she held an earlier board position. Enjoy!

Do you come from a quilting or crafty background? What originally brought you to the quilting world? Why and when did you make your first quilt?

I have always been a sewer – since elementary school. Technically, I made my first quilt in about the fourth grade. I used to go to my grandmother's, and she would let me use her sewing machine. I started quilting in 1992 or 1993. I lived in Fairbanks, AK and stopped at a local quilt shop for fun after seeing beautiful quilts at the local fair. I bought a book and some fabric and got started. I cut my first quilt by drawing on fabric and cutting it out with scissors. Shortly thereafter I took a class at that same shop and discovered rulers and rotary cutters.

Do you have a favorite style of quilt-modern, reproduction, appliqué, art....? A favorite type of fabric? A favorite designer? A favorite quilt you have made?

I have tried many styles of quilting. I have primarily been a machine piecer across time – usually more

traditional patterns. That is evolving. I am fascinated by curves, so have tried many patterns that incorporate curves, such as fans, Dresden plates, wedges, and other forms of curves. In the past few years, I have been exploring curves, circles and inserting these shapes into my quilts. I have been participating

in the KQ Improv group for the last year or so. This group is really challenging me to use more and different techniques and combining techniques in a quilt. My quilts are definitely more modern than traditional these days.

I was asked to make the KQ Raffle Quilt for the 2024 drawing. The result was *Hawaiian Sunrise*. I used my nine-degree wedge ruler to make the large center medallion and designed the corner elements. I used freezer paper to make patterns and templates in order to piece the curved elements. As part of the process I made a full-sized prototype, to test design elements and constructability.



Have you taken a class or experienced a teacher who influenced you or made a lasting impression on your work?

Starting in 2019, I began taking classes from Patricial Belyea, learning her design techniques and methods for curves. I still attend an annual retreat with her, where she presents participants with a design challenge and introduces new elements. I have also been experimenting with fabric design such as marbling and fabric printing.

Have you ever made a quilt where once was enough with that technique? I'll never make another one like that again!

I am not a big fan of foundation paper piecing. I have recently tried freezer paper piecing, which works better for me. This has led me to try some New York beauty blocks.

What is the allure of quilting that keeps you wanting to make more?

I enjoy quilting and seeing the results. I am very engaged in designing my own quilts and truly enjoy that aspect.

Do you have some words of wisdom that you have found helpful in navigating through life?

Do what you truly enjoy. Take advantage of workshops, classes, small groups offered by the Guild – there is so much to learn, and it is fun to sew with others!

Thank you, Barb, for sharing your journey. Your spirit of volunteerism is an inspiration.

- Welcome to those attending fall retreat, our sewing vacation at Seabeck Conference Center in Seabeck. Enjoy sewing on any project, visit with friends, share ideas, have your meals supplied and relax. Please refer to Seabeck@seabeck.org for more information and maps of the grounds.
- Arrival time: 10:30 a.m. or later on Wednesday. This gives retreat planners time to make sure the sewing rooms are set up and ready for you to sew. Only the planners will arrive at 10. Note: Seabeck's policy states that the group will be charged \$100 an hour if they arrive early. Thank you for your cooperation in arriving 10:30 or later. If you arrive on another day other than Wednesday, you can come at any time. Departure time on Sunday is by 1:00.
- <u>Sign In:</u> Meeting House sewing area. Unload. Pick up your keys if staying in the Pines. The Annex rooms are in the Historic Inn, no keys for these rooms.
- <u>Unload sewing items</u> at the Meeting House sewing area or the Pines sewing area. Choose your table. Please move your car as soon as you are done unloading.
- <u>Parking:</u> Once done unloading, please move your car. The Pines parking lot is only for those who sleep in the Pines. All others need to move their car down to the parking area by the Historic Inn. You may put your personal items in your room at any time. The Pines parking lot is also shared by another group who is staying in the lower level of the Pines.
- <u>Supply lists available:</u> Contact Val Martinson or Donna Gearns. It is the same list that we had available at signups in September.

We need several volunteers to bring:

- Ironing board and iron that they are willing to share with others. We need three for downstairs and one for upstairs at the Meeting House. If you are sewing in the smaller Pines sewing area, we will also need an iron and ironing board to share. If you bring a smaller iron to use at your sewing table area, please share with those sewing around you.
- We will also set up two large cutting tables downstairs and one upstairs in the Meeting House. An extra cutting table will also be supplied in the Pines sewing area for cutting. We need several volunteers to share their large cutting mats and rulers in each sewing area.
- Many of us bring snacks to share during the day with others.
- **Optional friendship block:** Norma Tipton will have an example and instructions to make the block. Bring scraps of bright, happy multicolored. Light background of your choice. Scraps 10" to 12" The drawing will be on Saturday night.
- **BINGO GAME Saturday night** hosted by Donna Gearns. The Bingo game is back again this year! Bring a fat quarter for each game you want to play; there will be 5 games total. The winner of each game wins all the fat quarters.
- There are still spaces available in overnight rooms in the Annex and Pines building. Our cap of day only participants is at 16. Once we fill the overnight rooms we can add onto day participants. If you want to invite a non-member for an overnight participation, the guild approved several years back that a nonmember could attend retreat by paying and additional \$30. We want to fulfill our contract obligation so as not to incur additional fees.









