President's Message-Karen Boeve

Happy New Year, and welcome to 2025! For many people, the New Year is a fantastic time to set resolutions and start new habits. I have set some Quilty resolutions for myself, including learning more about Improv quilting and contributing more to our Guilds community charities. I have also set some health goals for myself, or perhaps it would be more accurate to say, my doctor set some health goals for me. However they came about, all my goals together feed my heart, mind and body.

Did you know that volunteering can benefit your health as well? Research has shown that volunteering offers significant health benefits, especially for older adults, including improving both our physical and mental health. For adults, age 60 and over, volunteering provided benefits to physical and mental health. Volunteers report better physical health than non volunteers. Research also has shown that volunteering leads to lower rates of depression and anxiety, especially for people over 65.

Volunteering reduces stress and increases positive, relaxed feelings by releasing dopamine. By spending time in service to others, volunteers report feeling a sense of meaning and appreciation, both given and received, which can have a stress-reducing effect.

Reduced stress further decreases the risk of some physical and mental health problems, such has heart disease, stroke, depression, anxiety and general illness. In addition, people who volunteer have lower mortality rates than those who do not, even when controlling for age, gender and physical health.

So next time I see my doctor, I can share that in addition to his suggestions, quilting and being part of this wonderful guild is contributing to improving my health.

I wish you a happy, healthy New Year and much Quilty happiness!

Quilt Drop-Off Information—Keitha Unger

Quilters, please make arrangements to leave your quilts with the Drop-Off Volunteers between Friday, February 7, 2025 and Tuesday, February 11, 2025..

All quilts must be registered and must have a "QUILT ID TAG" issued for the quilt you are delivering. No quilt will be accepted without it.

PLEASE NOTE THE FOLLOWING: Any quilt wider than 48" must have a 4" sleeve. Please see the additional instructions on the website.

Quilts up to 94" long will be on the regular standards. Quilts 95" to 97" may be on the regular standards provided the sleeve was put on at least 2" from the top. Otherwise they must be pinned up. Quilts between 96" and 110" wide and 98" to 110" long will be on the larger standards. The ID tag should say "Contact Luisana/ Set-up for hanging instructions" for both sets of oversized.

Quilts will be available for pick-up starting Monday, February 17, 2025 at the Drop-Off Points. No quilts will be released at the close of the show.

The Spring Retreat lodging and sewing will be located in the new Pines building at Seabeck. We will have the lower level of the building. The sewing space is large with lots of natural light and there is a nice kitchen. Pines lower level has 10 sleeping rooms with capacity for 18 overnight guests. There are 4 single rooms, 4 double rooms, & 2 triple rooms. Each room has a bathroom and linens (sheets/towels) are provided. We need to have 14 Full time retreaters to meet our contract obligation.

COSTS FOR RETREAT:

FULL TIME: \$475—4 nights, 5 days, 13 meals (lunch Mon. through lunch Friday)

DAY USE: Choose your day(s) and optional meals. No overnight.

\$10 a day plus \$10 one time table fee.

Optional meals/day: Breakfast \$10, Lunch \$12, Dinner \$14

- If unable to sign up in person, ask another member to do it for you or contact Sarah
- Seabeck is able to accommodate dietary restrictions-let us know if you need a form to fill out
- A supply list will be emailed to retreaters 2-3 weeks before retreat. We will have a friendship block (optional) and some other fun activities.
- Please bring snacks to share

Do not arrive at retreat before 10:30 on Monday to set up. The organizers need to arrive first. If we arrive too early, Seabeck will fine our group.

If you are feeling unwell, please stay home. We would like to keep our members safe and healthy since we are sewing in close quarters.

Hello fellow Quilters,

I would like to discuss our snuggles program.

First, I would like to talk about the different organizations we currently partner with. This year we have five charities that we are working with to provide bundles to vulnerable children.

- 1. The Navy represents our biggest demand. We make a delivery to them at the end of each year of 150-175 bundles.
- 2. Washington State Patrol handed out twenty-five bundles during the month of December and are currently asking for more.
- 3. Olympic Ambulance has sixteen trucks and handles about two children's cases per month. At the beginning of December, we provided them with sixty-four bundles. They will need sixty-four more in February.
- 4. Easter Seals: Children with Autism (new charity for us): We delivered them thirty-five bundles in December that they would be providing to each child currently in their program. We are currently unsure when they will need more but we agreed they will reach out when they need more bundles.
- 5. Olympic College Resource Department (new charity for us): They received fifteen bundles before Christmas for their students who are living in RVs and cars with little children. We are currently unsure when they will need more but we agreed they will reach out when they need more bundles.

Second, I would like to discuss what our needs are to meet our current and future demands. A bundle consists of three components. A doll quilt, a stuffie and ribbon.

- If you have never made a doll quilt before it is any quilt between a range of 12"X12" to 18"X18" (Exact size is not critical because stuffie sizes vary as well).
- If you are working on other projects, do not have time to make a doll quilt, but have some orphan blocks that you can donate, that would be helpful.
- If you have the time and desire to make a doll quilt from orphan blocks, please reach out to me and once I (hopefully) get some orphan blocks I can supply those to you.
- Stuffie donations are always appreciated.

I am proud to be a part of a guild with such compassionate and generous members and have total confidence that we will get enough donations to meet our partner charity's needs. I am thrilled to be the chair of this program and am still trying to get my feet under me. There is a post on our Facebook page, made by a guild member who works at Olympic college, showing how thrilled a little girl was to receive her snuggles package. I recommend checking it out if you want to see the joy this program provides to kids in a vulnerable place.

There are three new fabric lines in the shop this month.


First is Love is in the Air from Clothworks.


