#### July 22: Auffle (Auction/Raffle)

What is an Auffle? It is a cross between and Auction and a Raffle. It is also known as a bucket raffle, Chinese raffle/Auction, penny social or a tricky tray. Lots of different names, but lots of fun!!

The Auffle involves multiple prizes with each prize having its own bucket (receptacle) for the deposit of tickets based on the participant's choice. Participants purchase tickets which they can distribute among the items they want to win. A participant is free to choose whichever bucket/prize by dropping their stub in the bucket of their choice. Of course, the person with the most tickets in item's bucket has the highest chance of winning that item. Once the sale of tickets has been closed and all sold tickets are deposited in the respective buckets, a person selects a lucky winner from each bucket. Tickets will be sold the night of the event for \$1.00 a piece or 6 tickets for \$5.00. The Kitsap Quilters Guild receives 100% of the proceeds from this event.

#### Kitsap Quilter's 2025 Library Quilt Challenge

At the March meeting, the 2nd Kitsap Quilter's Library Challenge was mentioned......so here are the details. As with last year's, this challenge is designed to get our members using and exploring the books in our library.

Challenge – Kitsap Goes Modern: Use a modern quilting book from our library (or your own or the Kitsap Library) to make a modern (or modernish) quilt. Our library has 22 books that have been identified as "modern", ranging from improv to modern interpretations of classic blocks or quilts. See the list below.

Some key concepts to explore are: use of solids only, negative space, minimalism, asymmetry, modern traditionalism, and low volume....to name a few.

Size – the quilts can be any size

**Timeline** – we will show the quilts/quilt tops at the October 2025 meeting, giving us plenty of time to get a top or entire quilt completed. At the meeting we'll each share what book we used, what we learned, and reveal our quilts.

I will work with the Quilt Show leaders to get a category for hanging our Library Challenge Modern quilting interpretations at the next show.

I am also volunteering to facilitate a small Contemporary Quilt Study Group – details are in a separate article.

### 3rd Saturday Workshops—Audrey Fitzgerald

On **19 April** Sarah Lewis will lead us through the assembly of a zippered pouch that resembles a **small in-box** when unzipped. This low-slung bag isn't overly tall but opens into a great shape to keep everyday sewing notions, clips, pencils and pens, or anything else that needs to be corralled when running loose. Once you have made one, I bet you could figure out how to adapt the pattern to any size to meet future requirements. You will have the option of making one that is floppy and packs easily or one with stiffer sides thereby enabling it to stand open with ease. Workshop is full but I can start a standby list in case of cancellations.

Leslie Stapleton will be taking a break from Hospice and Cancer quilts on **17 May** and will be offering instructions on how to make **ornaments** from Styrofoam balls and material. Although traditionally made for Christmas, these ornaments would do equally well for Easter, to perhaps hang from a mobile over a baby crib, or in any other setting where a bit of color is wanted. You can get a sneak peek at the ornaments and construction method during a guild meeting at the sign up table.

Margaret Jones will be making another appearance on **21 June** with her AccuQuilt cutter and assorted dies. This will be a chance for you to check out how the cutting system works, cut out shapes that appeal to you and pick up some skills with **raw edge quilting**. Bring a project you are currently working on that you want to add a bit of zip to with applique or just bring fabric pieces and backgrounds to play with. The idea is to get comfortable with this technique. Although you can affix the applique to your projects with a straight stitch, you may want to bring a sewing machine that has blanket, zig zag or other decorative stitches so you can just doodle around for the sheer fun of it.

Another **Free Sew** will be offered **19 July**. Bring your own project to sew with fellow guild members or pick up one of the offered pre-cut Cuddles, Hospice or Cancer kits that will be made available for this event. Barbara Peterson, Leslie Stapleton and I will be making up more kits in one of the conference rooms while you sew, and I don't think any of us would object if you wanted to take a kit home with you for later.

In person signups for workshops are in the church lobby during guild meetings. If you are not able to sign up for a workshop in person, please contact me to sign up ). The workshops run from 10:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. at the church and there is a \$5.00 class fee. Supply lists will be emailed out a couple of weeks before the workshop to allow for the gathering of materials.

Please remember that workshops are led by quilters like you who have volunteered to share a project with their fellow guild members. If there is something that you enjoy doing or a favorite project that might be of interest to other sewers and you would like to share, please contact me. Also, fresh ideas for future workshops are always welcome.

They have very few requirements but are requesting placemats without batting, so they are easier to put in the delivery boxes. I am making kits to be made by guild members that can be brought back for delivery. If you have fabric you would like to use, that is acceptable as well. I have downloaded a self-binding placemat pattern from Shabby Fabrics that also has a video, but it is totally acceptable to




